
Proposed Girls Hostel at Centre of Excellence Govt. College Sanjauli





In this session students were encouraged to interact with committee members without any apprehension. Students actively participated in sharing their problem



Women cell on 2nd august 2023 organized a workshop on Health and Hygiene in collaboration with Rotary club Shimla at college auditorium with a motto that 'empowerment begins with awareness'. The chief guest for the occasion was Dr Ram Lal, Professor Opthalomology, IGMC and our guest of honour and key note speaker was Dr Nishi Sood, Prof of Gynaecology Obstetrics at Kamla Nehru Hospital, Shimla. Other dignitaries Dr BhupinderSingh, Principal COE Sanjauli, Mr Amit Pal Sood President Rotary Club and alumni of our college, Mr AjitButail former president Rotary Club and Mr Manchanda, Optician and media personnel were also present. The first half of the workshop began with a welcome note by Associate Professor HimaniSaxsena to the August gathering.
