The aim of this seminar was to enlighten students about the Indian economy, the problem faced by our economy, its solutions and role of the Government in improving our economic status.

He arrived at 11:30 am with Dr. C.B Mehta (Principal), Dr. R.L Sharma (associate professor economics) and Dr. G.P Kapoor (Professor Economics). The event started with lightening of lamp by the chief guest. Dr. R.L Sharma welcomed the chief guest and the principal, he also shared his views on the Indian Economy by starting from our economic past to present and future. He stated that, the Indian economy is the seventh largest economy and our target is to make it third largest economy of the world, he said that our economy is growing at the rate of 6-7 percent and we aim to reach at 9 percent by 2020-25. He also discussed various challenges and potentials of the economy. After this Dr. T.R Sharma shared his experience of economic research of last 3 decades, he said that britishers exploited India for over 200 years which resulted in economy depression, in India, economy reforms started after Independence.

We followed a mixed economic approach in presence of our first Prime Minister Shri. Jawahar Lal Nahru. He mentioned about the five year plans which were started within objective of economic development and social justices, we achieved a remarkable growth of 6 percent in first five year plan, but rapid growth of population slowed down the growth rate to 4.5

percent in second five year plan, so more stress was given on capital goods. During the third five year plan Shri Lal Bahadur Shastri, the Prime Minister of India gave the slogan of "JAI JAWAN JAI KISAN" and hence gave birth to green revolution in india, many

industrial policies were adopted in the year 1977 for the growth of small scale Industries.

He told that the objective of these policies were to increase production and exports, but still we have not reach our economic goals

In the end he suggested some measures to boost our economy such as:

1. We should increase investment, employment and exports.
2. Secondary sector should be strengthened.



3. Productivity of labour, which is very low should be increased.
4. Skill enhancement programs should be started for increasing labour efficiency.

He concluded by thanking the teachers and students of the college for inventing him.



The seminar started at 12:30 pm, the judges were Mrs bharti Bhagra, Mrs Ruby, Mr Kishori lal chandel. There were 18 students participating with different topics (Indian Budget, education, agriculture, financial market, multiplier and accelerator,



unemployment etc) assigned to them. They all started with their presentation one by one, all were well prepared and confident with their speech. The first to come was Ayush, who spoke on Indian Budget 2019-20 along with Tapender, Neelam, Yashpal and Nitesh. Akshay and Saurav spoke about Indian

Economy, Dishant and Ruchika both talked about agriculture, Dixit, Asad, Pradeep, Manish spoke on financial marketing, article 370 and 35A, multiplier & accelerator, transportation respectively. Chief guest and all judges

appreciated all the participants and in the final judgment Nitesh (5th semester) secured first place, Ruchika (5th semester) second and Pradeep (second year) was third. The winners were honored with prizes by the chief guest. The penultimate speech was given by the principal as he congratulated all the students for participating. He said that the topics brought up in the seminar were covered all the major aspects of the Economy and hence provided great deal of knowledge to the students as well as the staff members present in the seminar.
