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Students' Feedback Analysis 2020-21

The students are fairly satisfied by the curriculum design and the syllabi offered by the college. They are also happy with the extent to which the syllabus is transacted by the teachers during the course of the academic session. They are also largely satisfied by the quality of its transaction. Only 8 percent students are of the view that the syllabus was not delivered as per their expectation. The students feel satisfied by the teaching techniques used by the teachers. The assessment and evaluation systems adopted by the college are perceived as being fair, transparent and effective. The opportunities they get for participation in experiential learning processes like internships, workshops, seminars and field trips seems a little unsatisfactory. Despite the minor irritants and reasons for dissatisfaction, students are by and large happy with their experience in the college. The suggestions from students that were received, were largely as follows:

- Experiential learning opportunities need to be augmented
- Facilities and infrastructure for sports need to be enhanced
- The canteen needs better facilities and options
- Activities that enhance critical thinking and argumentative skills need to be encouraged
- More guest lectures to be included in the curriculum
- The odd-even system for students' attendance needs to be done away with so that students may be able to attend more classes
- The Arts block needs to be upgraded/renovated

Parents' Feedback Analysis 2020-21

Parents and guardians of students studying in Govt College Sanjauli have responded proactively to the request to provide feedback about the college, its curriculum and facilities. Parents were largely satisfied with the academic and extra-curricular activities that their wards were part of the feel that their children are safe in the college and do not feel that they are discriminated against on the basis of Caste/Class or gender. They feel especially sanguine about the outcome of the mentor program that the college has in place. They are reasonably satisfied with the delivery of content and the transparency of the evaluation system.

Teachers' Feedback Analysis 2020-21

The teachers are averagely satisfied with the prescribed syllabi/curriculum for transaction in their respective programmes. There has been a mixed opinion about their sense of satisfaction over issues like freedom to negotiate the contents with respect to flexibility and time. Many teachers feel that the courses are not designed and decided upon democratically. Most teachers feel the syllabi have helped them enrich themselves in the process.

Alumni' Feedback Analysis 2020-21

The alumni feedback from people who have been students of Government College Sanjauli in various years has been interestingly varied. There is a marked change in responses of people from earlier batches and those from recent years. While most alumni feel that the syllabi they studied were relevant and have helped them find prospects of livelihood, they feel that the other activities the college offered them have given them opportunities to develop holistically. The learning experiences have translated into meaningful life-skills. Regarding the learning environment in the college most alumni are satisfied with campus and infrastructure, the academic culture and warm environment. Their opinion on transparency of evaluation systems adopted by the college and student centredness of the initiatives of the college are mixed and ambiguous. This opinion however, changes progressively in recent years and has become more favourable. The suggestions from alumni were largely on following lines:

1. Research should be encouraged among students.
2. Syllabi should be upgraded regularly to make them competitive with eminent institutions.
3. Girls hostel should be made available on priority.

Action Taken

The feedback was analyzed and presented to the principal who in turn shared it with the staff council in a meeting convened at the end of the session, 2020-21. In the first meeting of the IQAC in the session 2021-22, the IQAC kept in mind, the outcomes of the feedback while prospectively planning the activities for 2021-22. It was decided that in addition to the other plans, teachers will submit department wise plans for activities that engage students in student-centric learning. All departments will ensure that students are made to participate in seminars, class-room presentations, group projects, field studies and research activities. Each department was asked to host guest lectures virtually since it was not possible to invite them while Covid-19 protocols were in place. The college compound will be upgraded to be used for Volleyball and Basketball. The multipurpose hall will get a new Badminton mat. The Arts block that is in the pipeline will be expedited on priority. More rooms will receive technological upgrading to enhance ICT usage in teaching.
