Excellence in these fields can lead to rewarding opportunities.

He emphasized the importance of ethical behavior and honesty. These values serve as green flags, indicating that a committee is likely to be a good fit. On the other hand, if a committee lacks these qualities, it might be a red flag.

**Q. Advice for Club Involvement**: Mr. Harsh provided guidance on how to approach club involvement. He recommended focusing on original texts while studying and highlighted the significance of the "APW Generals." This advice can help us gain a deeper understanding of our subjects and excel in our studies.
