FRENCH REVOLUTION

The first presenter was Miss. SNEHA who delved into the complexities of the French Revolution, highlighting the background of revolution, political, social and economic situation, causes, financial crisis, social inequality, and Enlightenment ideas and Thinkers like: Rousseau, Montesquieu and Locke that sparked the uprising. She discussed pivotal events such as the creation of political clubs, national assembly, declaration of Rights of man and citizen, constitution, Storming of the Bastille, republic state, the Reign of Terror, directory rule, consequences of revolution and Napoleon's rise to power.
