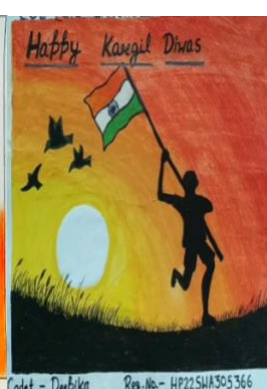

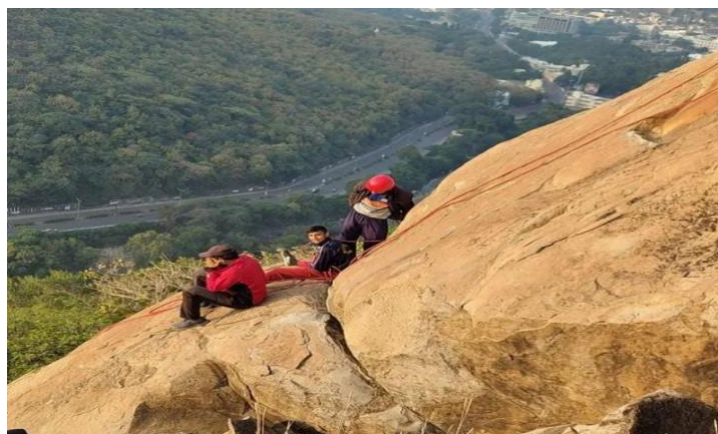
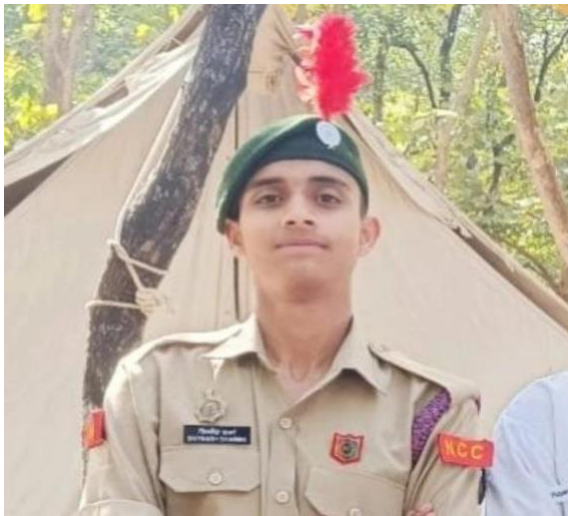
ROCK CLIMBING CAMP

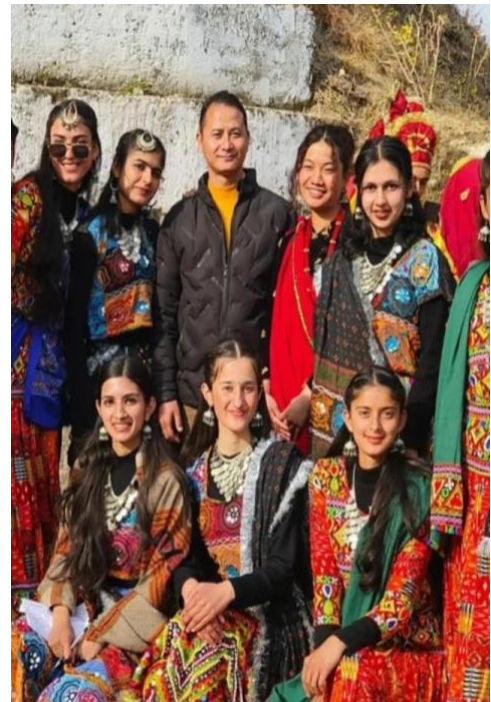

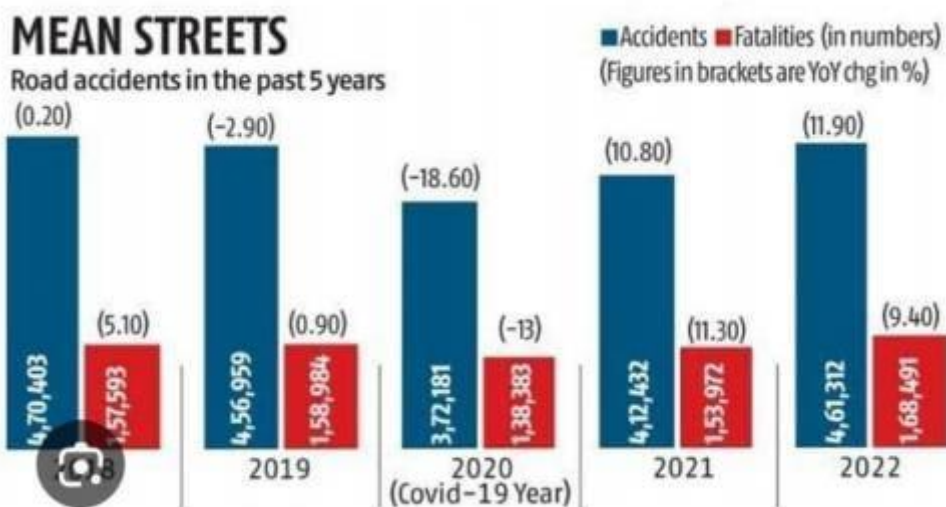
ROAD SAFETY

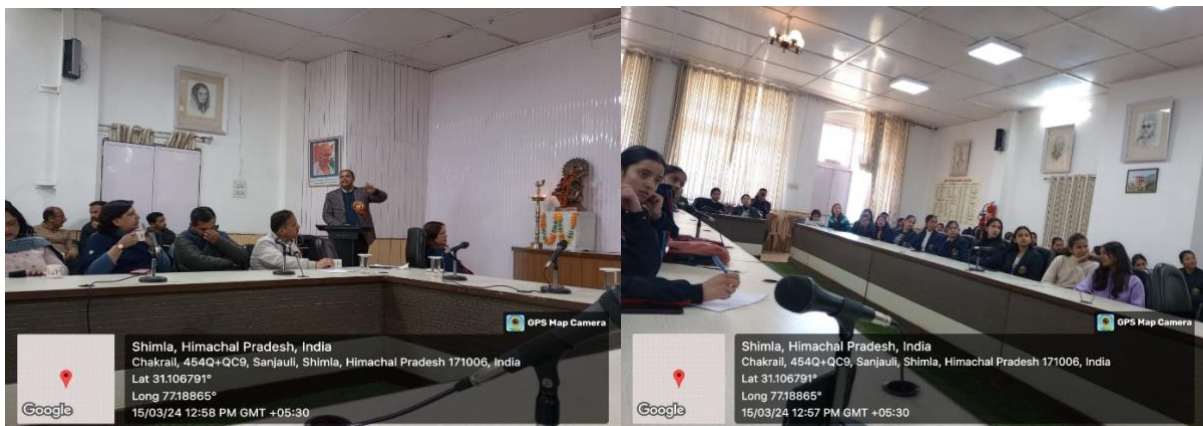
