

Report on Army Attachment Camp

The Army Attachment Camp at Mamun Cantonment was conducted from 4th to 13th November under the guidance of the 3 JAT Regiment. The camp aimed to provide cadets with practical exposure to Army life, discipline, and training. It combined physical endurance, technical knowledge, and inspirational experiences, making it a comprehensive program for young cadets aspiring to serve the nation.

The camp began with an opening ceremony, followed by a tour of the cantonment, where cadets observed ammunition and vehicle displays and attended sessions on basic infantry knowledge. Weapon classes were conducted on INSAS, LMG, and Mortar, while cadets also participated in sports activities to build teamwork and fitness.



Daily drill practices were held, along with an informative session on the Agnipath Scheme, which gave cadets insights into new opportunities in the Armed Forces. A visit to the 315 Kargil Artillery Unit allowed cadets to observe batteries, quarter guard, mess, temple, artillery fire demonstration, and night vision equipment. Physical training included a 5 km run, and visits were organised to the Aviation Corps (ALH Mk III & IV) and the Armoured Corps, where cadets explored different types of tanks such as Recovery, Ambulance, and Attack tanks.

Cadets also gained hands-on experience through INSAS live firing (3 rounds), participated in a night parade, and underwent jungle survival training that included making shelters, identifying edible items, and managing fire and water. Recreational

activities such as a movie screening and a cultural evening added joy and relaxation to the camp.

The camp concluded with a Closing Ceremony, followed by cultural performances and the traditional Bada Khana (Grand Feast), which marked a fitting end to the enriching experience.

It provided them with exposure to Army discipline, weapon handling, survival skills, and modern technology, while also inspiring them through informative sessions and demonstrations.
