- Cyber safety tips for children, parents, and women,
- Password safety, risks of sharing personal data, and the dangers of cyberbullying.

Volunteers used simple and relatable examples to make these concepts easy to understand. Additionally, information was provided on immediate actions to take after falling victim to an online scam and the recovery steps that should follow.


