Introduction:

The NSS Unit of Government College Sanjauli organized an informative session on

Organ Donation Camp on 12th September at our college. The NSS unit collaborated with **SOTTO** (**State Organ & Tissue Transplant Organisation**) **and IGMC** to host this insightful session at 12:00 PM in the conference hall. The session aimed at debunking myths and promoting the life-saving cause of organ donation.

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For the past 2-3 years, our NSS unit has been actively involved in organizing registration drives and Nukkad Nataks to raise awareness about organ donation. This sustained effort impressed

the nodal officer, Prof. Puneet Mahajan, who subsequently planned the session for our college. Over **130 volunteers attended** the program, which was also supported by both Programme Officers, Dr. Anupam Verma and Dr. Pooja Dulta.

Objectives:

The primary objectives of the programme were:

- 1. Raise awareness about the importance of organ donation.
- 2. Teach students about the benefits of organ donation.
- 3. Dispel myths and misconceptions surrounding organ donation
- 4. Register a significant number of people as organ donors.
- 5. Explain the different types of organ donation (living, deceased, tissue).

About the Program:

The program started at 12:00 PM and was called *Bano India Ke Ang Daata*. The session began with *RJ Shalini*, who raised awareness about organ donation. *Dr. Naresh* and his team from IGMC then gave a detailed explanation about organ donation, including the process and procedures. They highlighted how organ donation can save lives and discussed the ethical and legal aspects of it.

They also talked about the online pledge to become an organ donor and encouraged students to take the pledge if they wished. The speakers shared how organ donation

can change people's lives and help others in need.

By providing important information and encouraging everyone to act, the camp helped promote a culture of organ donation, which can save lives and positively impact communities.
