The podcast, titled "<u>Navigating the Legal Frontiers of Space Economy</u> <u>Admist Weaponisation Challenges"</u>. The podcast provided a platform for an interactive discussion with the global leader Dr. Vernonica.

Objective:

Key Highlights:

Dr. Moronese highlighted the need for updating and reinforcing these legal structures to address contemporary challenges, such as the weaponization of space assets and the commercialization of space activities. Dr. Moronese elaborated a significant portion of the discussion on the weaponisation of space.

Interaction with volunteers:

The interactive session with volunteers was a main highlight of the podcast. Volunteers asked thoughtful and pertinent questions, reflecting their keen interest and understanding of the topic. Some of the questions asked by volunteers are given below:

How is it ensured that the peace is maintained, and sustainable exploration takes place in space? Are there any laws to make sure about it?

2. Tanmay Sharma (B.A. 2nd year):

There are many problems in our space but generally the problem is that satellites are being sent from every country so after few years there will be too much junk, so what is the solution to this problem.

3. Himani Kaushal (B.Sc. 2nd year):

What are the key legal challenges in regulating the weaponisation of space in the context of the burgeoning space economy and how can international law adapt to ensure the peaceful use of outer space while fostering economic growth?

4. Rishav Basu (B.A. 2nd year):

What are Dr. Veronica's views on cosmic entities we call God?
What are her views on the advanced Indian Civilisation who were very advance in astronomy?

5. Nitesh Niranjan (B.Sc. 2nd year):

What steps can be taken to ensure that space remains a peaceful and sustainable domain for all humanity?

6. Ayush Bhatt (B.Com. 2nd year):

What role can emerge technologies such as AI and autonomous system plays in shaping the legal landscape of space?


Recognition of Volunteers:
