Introduction

Nestled in the lap of nature and housed in a heritage building, the Centre of Excellence, Govt. College Sanjauli, Shimla, HP, has been providing an academically and intellectually stimulating environment to the students. Gist of deliberations/ information shared made by the Resource Persons

The two day national seminar on sustainable Development: Issue and Challenges commenced on 22nd October, 2021. The inaugural session being with the welcome of the Chief Guest Mr. Deepak Shanani Former Additional Chief Secretary to the govt. of Himachal Pradesh and the keynote speaker Prof. Simrat Kahlon, HOD, Department of Geography, Punjab University followed by felicitations. To invoke the blessing of goddess Saraswati a lamp lighting ceremony was held which was followed by Saraswati Vandana by students of Music Department.

Dr. C.B. Mehta, Principal Govt. College Sanjauli formally welcomed the guest and addressed the audience. He laid emphasis on sustained efforts by mankind for environment conservation and sustainable development. The book of abstracts on the sustainable development Issues and Challenges was released by the chief guest and other dignitaries. Dr. Kamayani Bisht introduced the theme of the national seminar and made audience aware of the proceedings of the event. Thereafter Dr. Ram Lal Sharma, Associate Professor, Department. Of Economics, Govt. College Theog introduced the concept of the seminar. He elaborated on need to address issues such as poverty/environment conservation/food security/Healthy life, education for all and gender equality to achieve goal of sustainable development. He hoped for the concrete outcomes of the National Seminar.

The keynote speaker, Prof. Simrat Kahlon, began by appreciating the collaboration of Department of Geography and Economics for organizing the National seminar She laid emphasis on taking the geographical aspects into consideration while town planning and how ignoring the local routes and cultures have led to faulty town construction which goes against the principles of sustainable development as can be seen in Shimla city itself. She stressed the need to preserve local cultures and wisdom without experimenting with different models of development based on exploitation of environment and reorient our thinking in order to produce a sustainable society and stress the need to shift from inanimate to animate source of energy.

The chief guest Sh. Deepak Shanani enlightened on seriousness of proximate threats to sustainable development in our country such as pollution of water bodies, deforestation, global warming, intensive farming and zoonotic diseases. He also talked about the agriculture crisis that is looking around due to salinity of water, droughts and temperature variation. He also spoke on degradation of land, water and public health posed by horrendous sanitation. He stressed upon the collective behavior change with instinct of self preservation. He also highlighted the ill effects of misleading false data and declarations. He appealed to the audience that fight for sustainability must also be a fight for a just, liberal and democratic world order and comity of nations.

Dr. Rajesh Dhortha Associate Professor and HOD, Commerce, COE, GC, Sanjauli proposed a vote of thanks after the inaugural session which was followed by the plenary session.

Dr. S. S. Randhawa, Principal Scientific officer, H.P. Council for Science technology and environment was the first speaker of the plenary session. He gave an informative lecture on 'Hazard vulnerability of HP'. He appealed to the audience about natural and manmade

hazards; major seismic zones based on the seismic map of India, major tectonic plates and how to reduce earthquake risk by reducing structural and non structural hazards.

Prof. N. S. Bisht, Rtd. Professor and Chairperson, Department. of Economics and Director, Centre for population studies being the second speaker gave an elaborate presentation on sustainable development. He focused on the implementation of policies so that the sustainable development can address the problems found by the poor people. He concluded his lecture by stating that immediate attention needs to be given to overcome the challenges of sustainable development. Sh. S.N. Joshi, Rtd. IAS officer and a renowned author and columnist gave a presentation based on original experiences and encounters on the topic 'Biodiversity loss in and around Shimla'. He highlighted efficiently how the development and anthropogenic activities have led to biodiversity loss in Shimla. He stated that 40% biodiversity loss is due to habitat loss and 32 herbal plant species are on the verge of extinction. He also stated that radiations have caused reduction in sparrow population. His enchanting poetic discourse held human beings responsible for such a distortion of natural habitat and fetched lots of attention from the audience.

Mr. Vaneet Jisthy, Scientist, Himalayan fresh research institute, was the last speaker of the plenary session. He gave a wonderful pictorial presentation on forest and sustainable cities. He succeeded in increasing the horizon of knowledge of the audience on various aspects of vegetation diversity of HP, impact of colonial establishment and effects of urbanization. He concluded by listing various parameters for sustainable city such as planned house construction, proper drainage system, waste management practices and also expressed on the need to develop urban forestry and green spaces.
