





2.6 (i) Number and nature of programmes

Ten anti-drug awareness programmes and campaigns were organized at the college level by our Anti-Drug Abuse Committee for the session 2024-25, including oath-taking ceremonies where students pledged to abstain from drugs and alcohol. Various activities were conducted throughout the year under the banner of NSS, NCC, and Rover & Rangers, featuring expert lectures, documentary screenings, and interactive sessions to ensure deeper understanding and long-term impact.

2.6 (iii) Counselling and support

In addition to awareness activities, the college has put in place a confidential support system for students suspected of substance use. A small number of students, whose identities were kept strictly confidential, received counseling from trained professionals in a non-judgmental and compassionate setting aimed at rehabilitation rather than punishment. Regular follow-up and access to counseling were ensured so that students in need could receive continuous guidance and support.

The institution remains firmly committed to organizing regular awareness drives, extension activities, and counseling initiatives focused on preventing drug abuse. Through these sustained efforts, the college strives to nurture a safe, healthy, and supportive academic environment that discourages substance abuse and promotes overall well-being.


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
